## From the Principal's Desk

March 13, 2020: Our last day of in-school classes for the 2019-2020 Academic Year. COVID 19 has begun to change everything at Notre Dame.

Student: "But that can't be! We have the play next week. Everything is set to go!"

Parent: "Will we still be marching in the St. Patrick's Day Parade?"

Faculty Member: "What do I do about the NHS Induction Ceremony?"

Thus began a spring of Google Classroom, conference calls, zoom meetings and classes, etc. Remote learning and meetings were now a part of every day. **The school building was empty.** 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter and 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter grading was very different. Everyone had to adjust. Many families were "locked" inside their homes; computers, tablets, and phones were the mode of communication; some parents lost their jobs while others were working from home, some full-time, some part-time. Easter was spent at home not with relatives. Graduation was now scheduled for Pocono Raceway and parents watched from their cars, wearing masks. Bishop Bambera was handing out diplomas from the "pit area" of the raceway as students prepared to take their "victory lap" around the tricky triangle. June 3<sup>rd</sup> was the last day of school although school was not finished with the usual fanfare.

Now the 2020-2021 Academic Year had to be planned. "Social distancing" became our mantra. The lockers were off limits; the hallways were divided; the 30 classroom desks were now 15; lunch was now half in the cafeteria and half in the Cawley Auditorium; cohorting for Grades 7, 8, and 9 was another new reality; masks breaks were included for Grades 7 and 8; Google Classroom was the standard, virtual learners were being live-streamed in every class, every day; ND was in 5 days a week; assessing was a challenge; chromebooks for Grades 8 and 9 and then Grade 7; cameras on the classroom computers ("I can't hear you.", "Turn on your camera."); live streaming liturgies and other assemblies; you-tube for basketball games and other assemblies; new teachers, new students; missing old students; empty building at 2:30

p.m.; no activities (Homecoming, Semi-Formal, Prom, AAG, picnics, extra-curriculars: gone).

**YET**, we did have classes, we did laugh (but in smaller groups), we did exchange ideas, we did learn, we did pray, we did have liturgies, we did socialize (to a lesser degree), we did get out of the house, we did commiserate as we talked, we did learn so much more about computers and Google Classroom, we did apply to colleges and 39 out of 40 seniors are continuing their education at a college, we did have some sports and we did have a great boys' basketball season as well as baseball and softball, we had very successful athletes winning a multitude of honors and awards, **We (Notre Dame) had the best year possible under "these circumstances."**

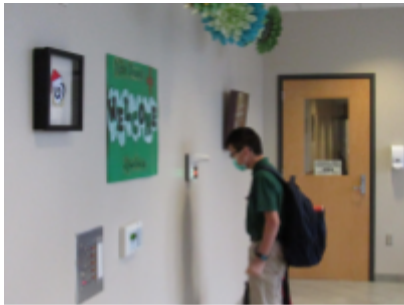


This was not the year we had hoped for but we had a good year as we all came to school together, kept safe, and did not have to close for COVID reasons. There is much to be said about enduring,

Divided hallways helped reduce congestion.



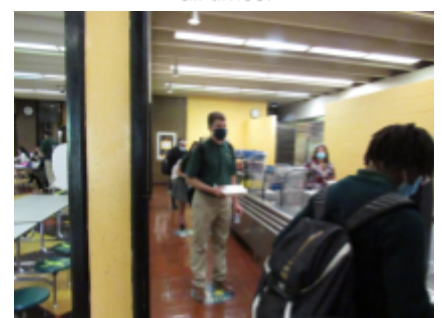
Students were safely distanced at all times.

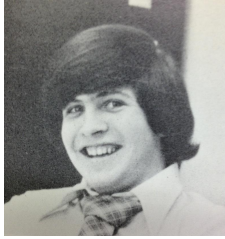

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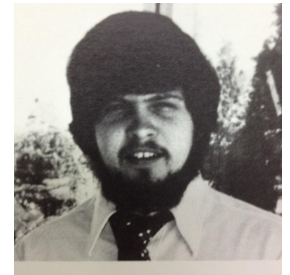
## Spartan Spotlight

**Angela Barlie '98** is representing all of us Spartans in Auckland, New Zealand these days.

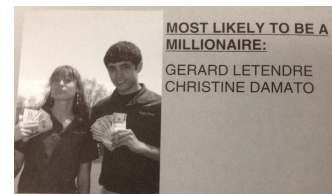

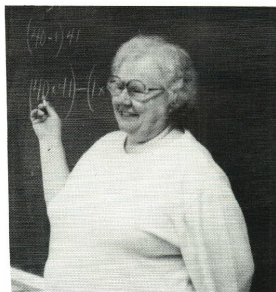
**Paul Kennedy '89**, wife Denise, and daughters Cara and Teagan just relocated to Fort Myers, Fla...look him up for a round of golf.
